Trustees announce exciting and ambitious development plans



Staying relevant to residents needs now and in the foreseeable future has lead the trustees to devise an ambitious development plan for the Centre which is intended to be implemented as soon as funding becomes available.

The plan includes:

- Creating an additional function room and social space by repurposing the existing toilets and changing areas;
- Installing a Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA);
- Building new changing rooms and toilets for football teams and users of the MUGA;
- Adding a conservatory adjacent to the existing meeting room;
- Improving the football pitch;
- Extending the existing overspill car park;
- Enhancing the interior and providing additional equipment to encourage a wider range of activities and increased usage;
- Adopting eco-friendly practices and improving health, safety and security features;
- Implementing effective marketing and sustainable income generation strategies.

Like the Centre's new Logo?

The Centre logo takes its inspiration from the original name of Acton Trussell as it appears in the Domesday Book of 1086. "Acton" is derived from the Anglo-Saxon meaning "oak" (āc) + town (tūn). The Trussells were a Norman family who were early lords of the manor. The tree also emphasises the rural nature of the 3 villages.

Trust applies to become a Charitable Incorporated Organisation

A Trust was established by the Parish Council and registered with the Charity Commission in 1986 to own and run the Acton Trussell Village Hall which was replaced by the Community Centre in 1990. The stage and extension were added in 2016.

Since the Trust's formation, charity law has evolved and a new form of governance created the Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) which grants added protection, wider powers and better regulation for trustees.

Last year the trustees decided to adopt the CIO constitution and are now in the process of applying to the Charity Commission to convert the present Trust as many village halls have done.

The change won't have any noticeable effects but will improve the way by which the trust operates. A public meeting will be held soon to explain things and answer any questions.

A Users Forum has been set up to which representatives of all regular and frequent user-groups are invited to join. Meeting a couple of times a year, the forum will enable groups to air their views, make suggestions for improvements and participate in marketing activities.

Borrow **Books** from our large collection available in the foyer. If you have any books surplus to requirements please add them to the collection.

The Thursday morning **Tea Room** is as popular as ever - particularly on the first Thursday of every month when bacon butties are on the menu! Come along for coffee, a chat and good company.

On Mondays between 2pm and 4pm the **Indoor Bowls Club** meets. It's not (too) competitive, just lots of fun with great tea and cakes. Everyone's welcome so come along and give it a try.

Families with youngsters should know that the **Kids Play Area** behind the Centre on the recreation ground is a safe and free place to have fun. Various, well-maintained equipment is securely fenced-in with adjacent car-parking and seating. There's also plenty of green space to kick a ball about and have a picnic - when the sun shines!
